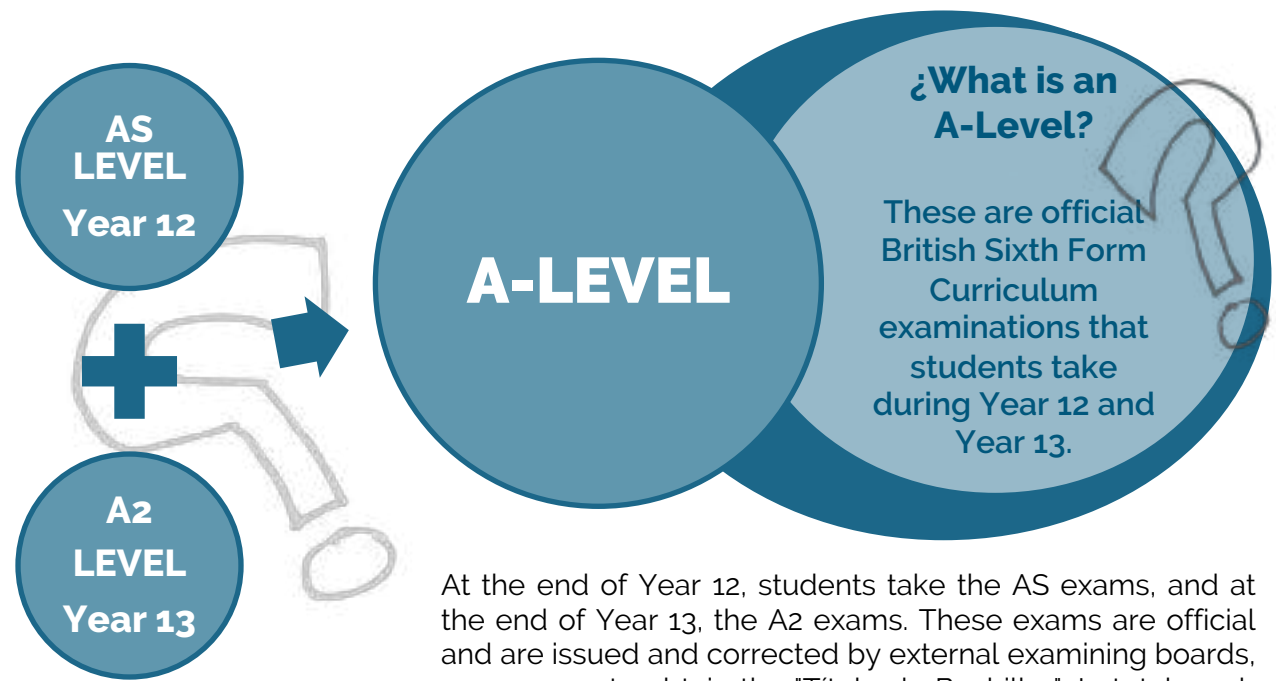

Students who have obtained a rating of A in all AS exams

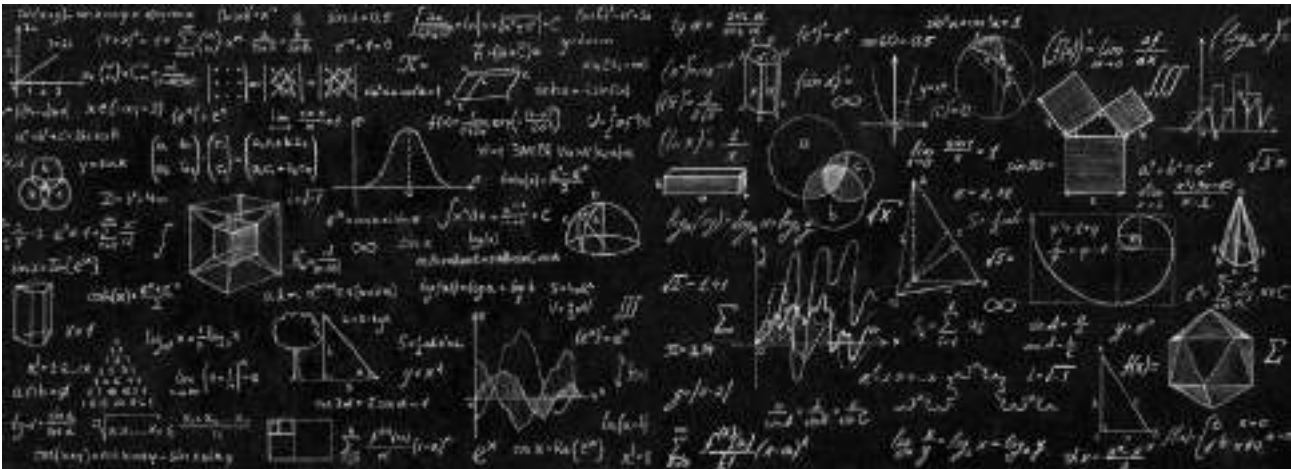


A* and A are the highest grades that can be obtained in A-levels.

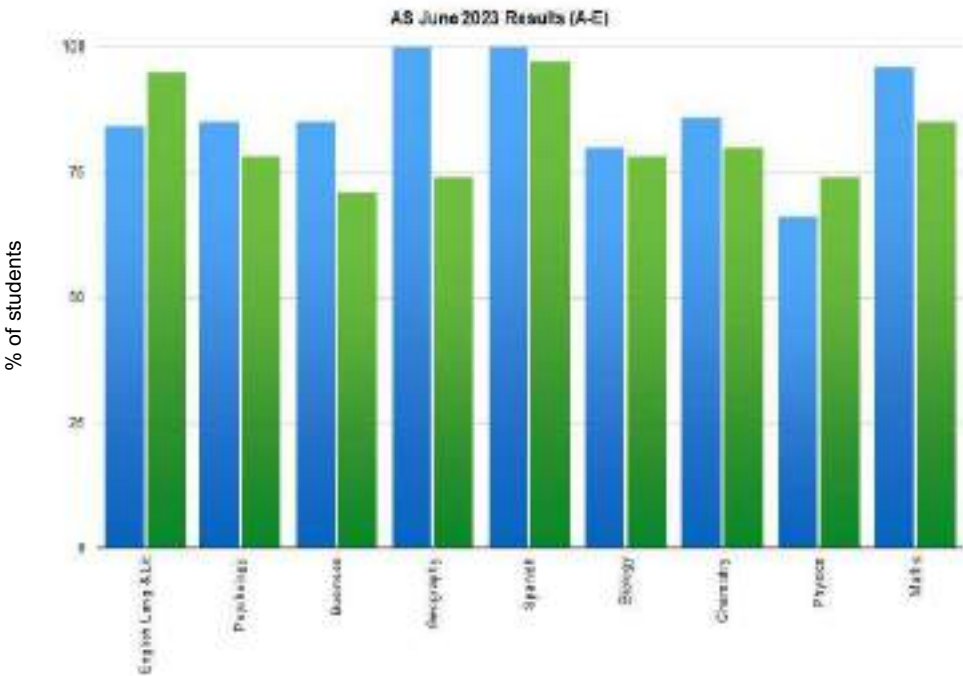

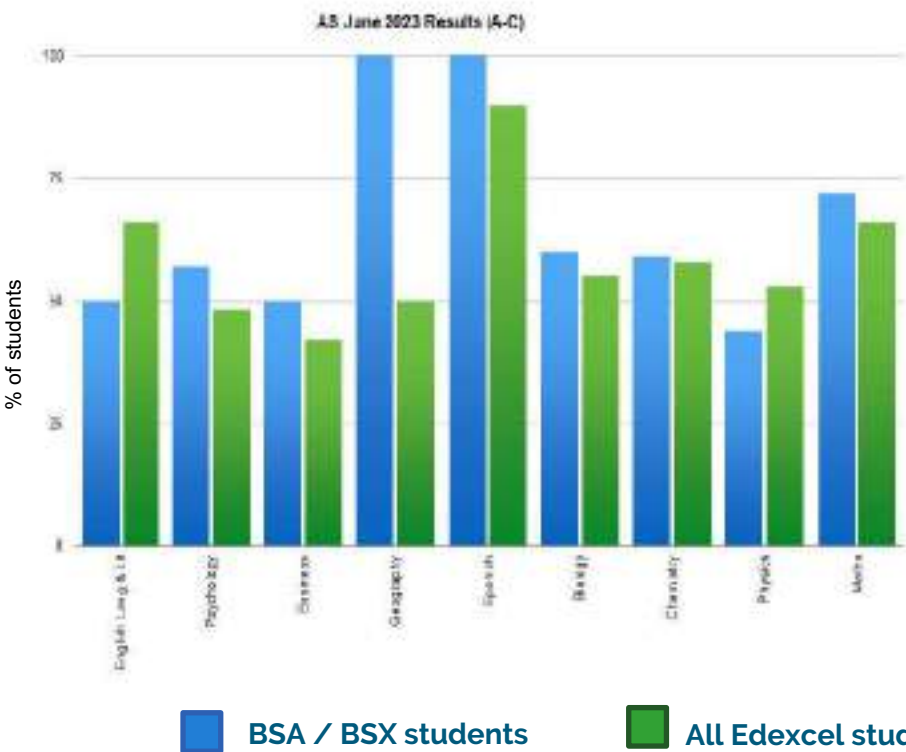
AS 2023 Official Exam Results (Year 12)

70% of our students passed all AS exams (grades between A and E) at the end of Year 12.



BSA and BSX students have passed more subjects such as **Geography, Psychology, Chemistry, Business Studies, Spanish, Mathematics and Biology** than the rest of the students.

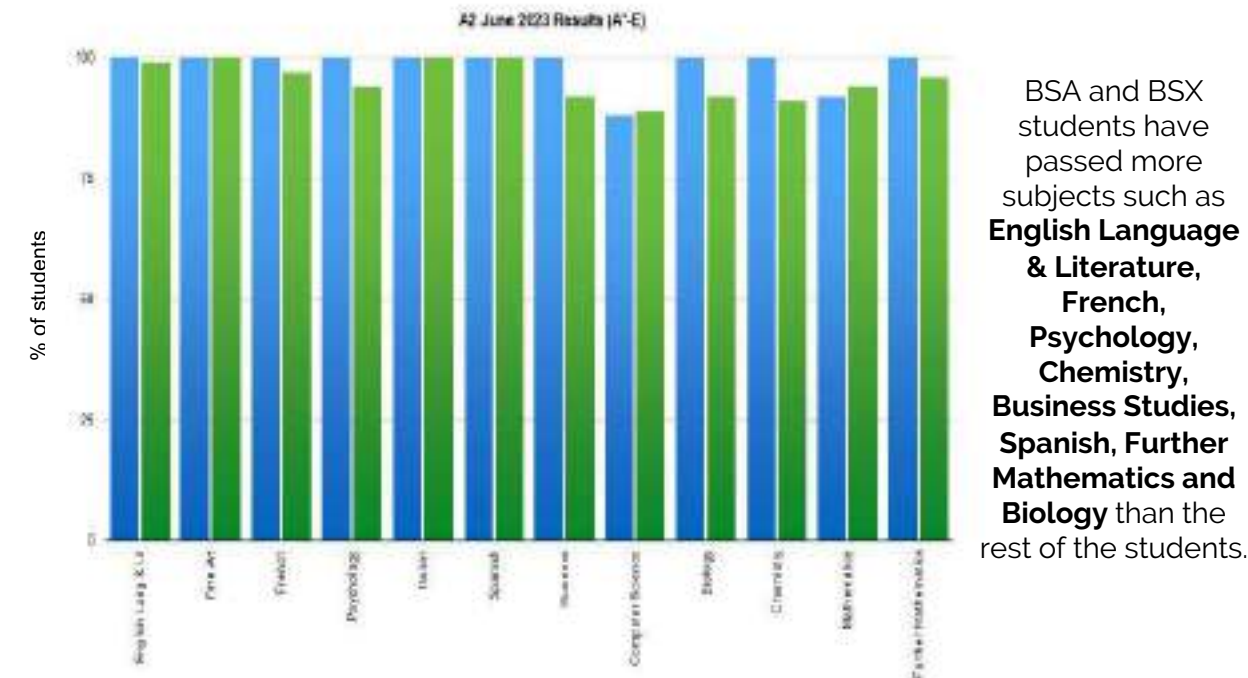
30% of our students obtained a grade between A and C in their AS exams at the end of Year 12.



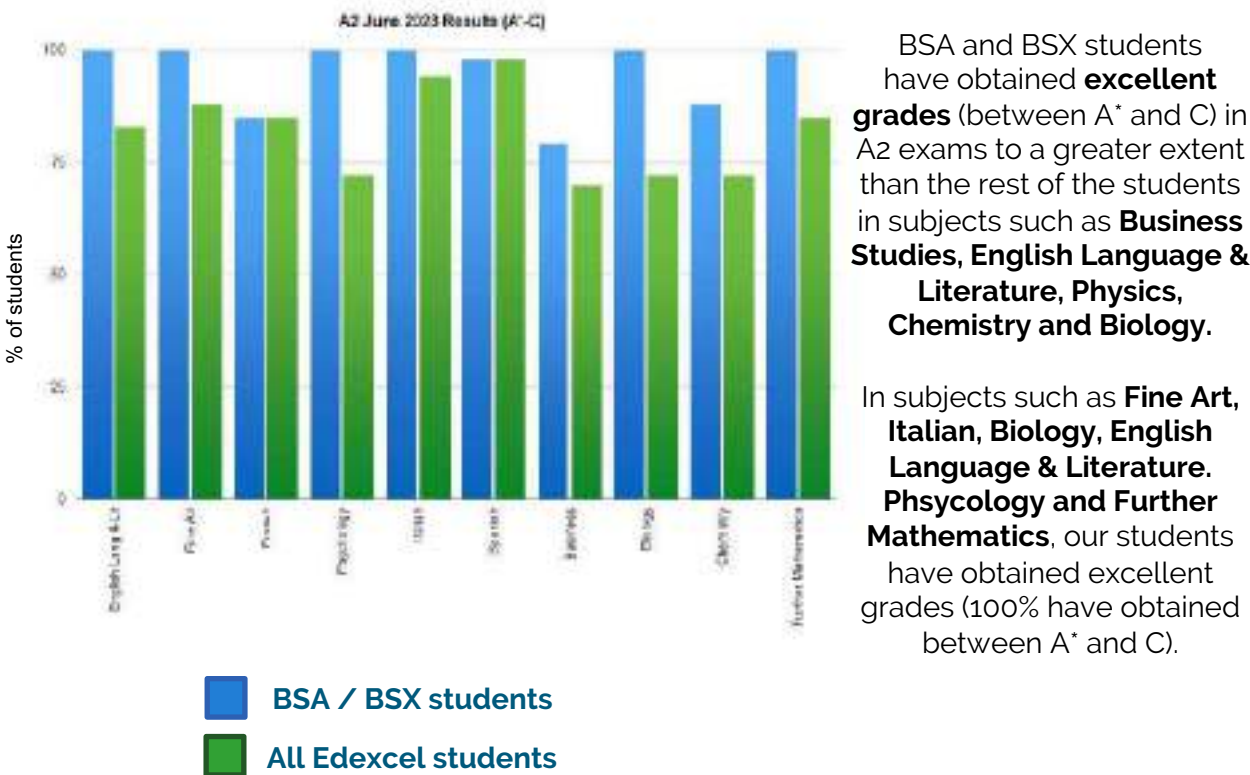

Examinations at the end of Secondary



At the end of Year 11, students take the IGCSE, official exams issued and corrected by external examining boards, as a means to obtain the "Graduado en Educación Secundaria" (Secondary Education Graduate). In total, each student takes an average of 7 or 8 exams, including the 3 core subjects (Maths, English and Science). They must pass at least 5 subjects, 2 of which must be core subjects.

To pass, you must obtain at least a score of 4 points on the exam, and the maximum score is 9 points.

International IGCSE Assessment 9-1 grading system for GCSE international qualifications

Qualifications are based on the **grading system introduced in the United Kingdom** that uses a **9-1 grading scale**.

The qualifications are objective: pupils are assessed against age related expectations which are outlined by the United Kingdom.

This system is progressive and requires that student's progress and they improve each term to maintain their grade; assessment criteria increases as the school year progresses. 1 is the lowest grade and 9 is the highest.



The 9-1 scale has been introduced in order to give outstanding achievers in a subject the opportunity to achieve a 9, rewarding outstanding academic achievement. As a result, the system offers better differentiation for higher achievers who will be graded at the upper end of the scale, helping to more readily identify their potential and enable them to have greater precision when it comes to choosing A levels and a future career that is best suited for them.

It also gives detailed information on how well a student has passed the subject (4,5,6).

A Level 4 and upwards / or a **"C"** (in SFL) is a pass at the end of Year 11.

Exceptions:

Given that **AS Spanish** is a subject, the grading system for it is based on the grading system for this subject is based on the old UK system of A-U, with E being a pass.

For students who are NOT studying IGCSE P.E. (Physical Education) or IGCSE ICT (Computer Science) as electives, the grade for these subjects is based only on the effort they have made in the subject and on the progress they have made in class.

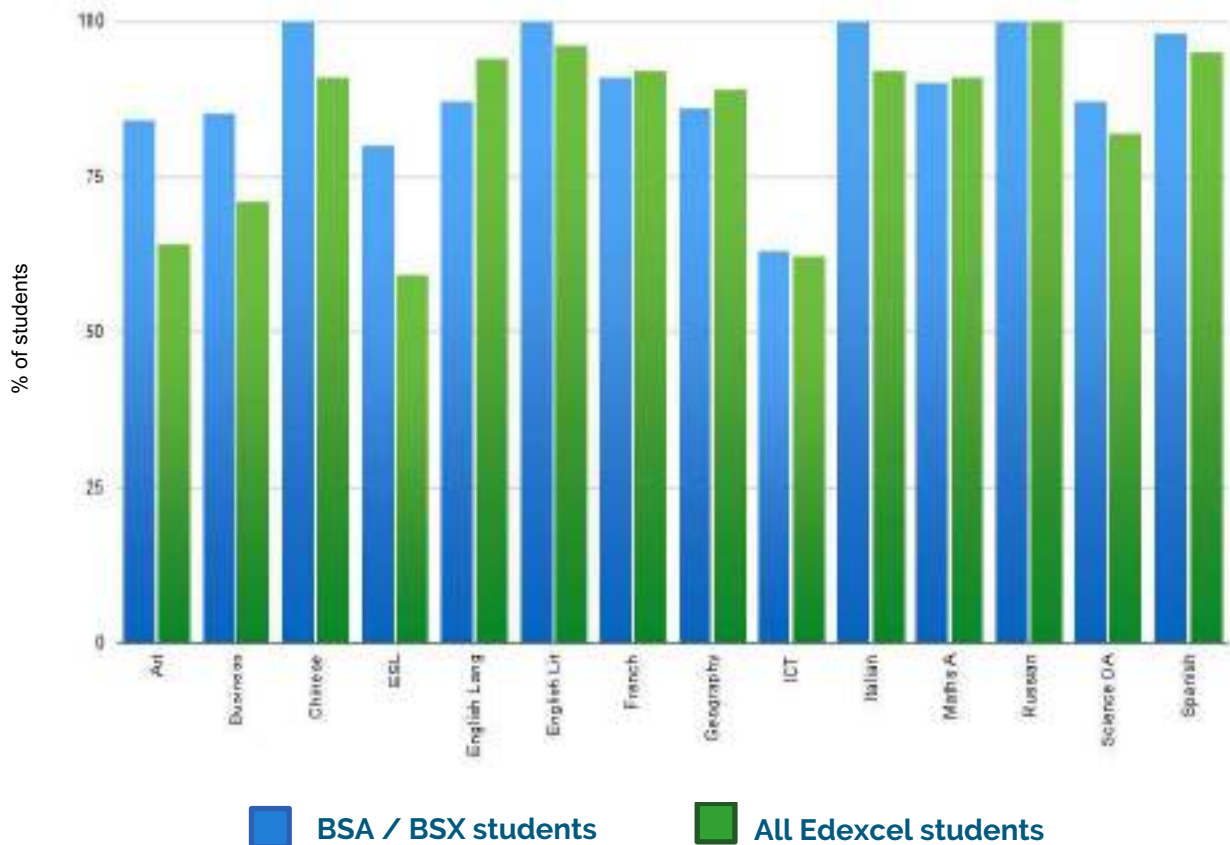

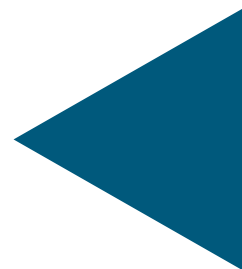

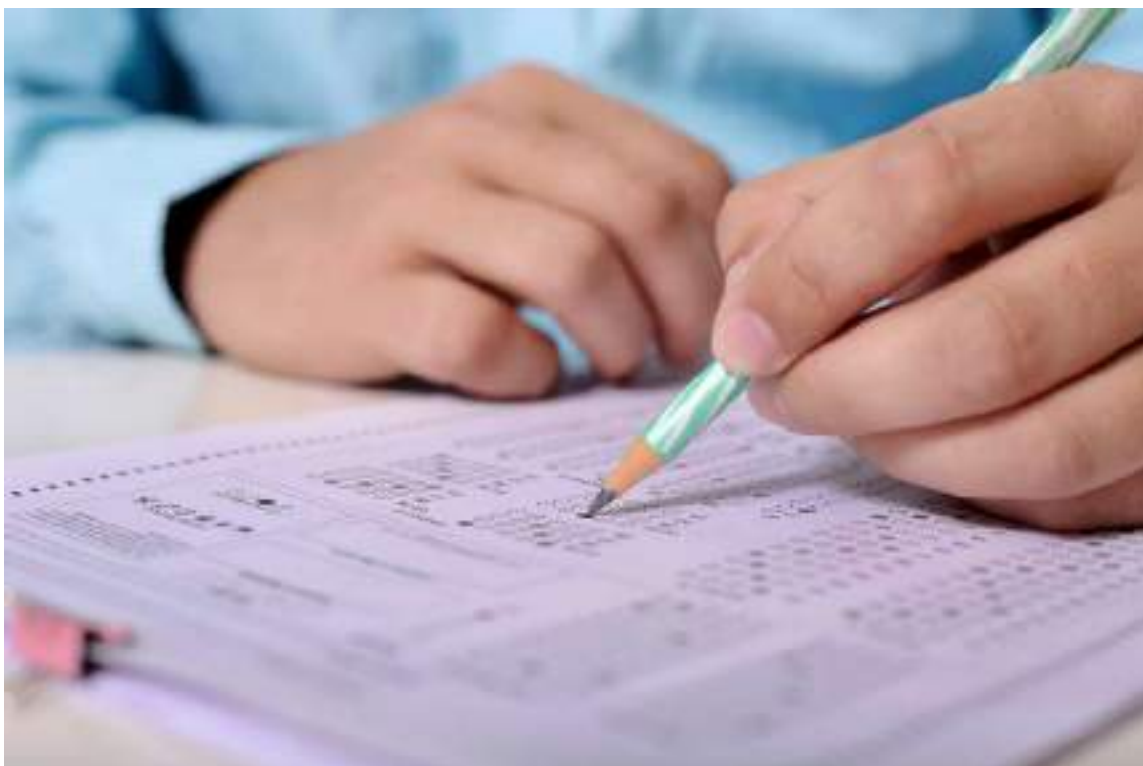


During the month of May, the final Key Stage 2 examinations (Year 6) in English Language, Mathematics and Science (GL Assessments) are carried out through an external assessment platform, which provides and guarantees a correct view of the student's performance, and allows us to offer valuable information to teachers so that they can optimize the support of students in their progress and learning in their Secondary stage.

GL Assessments have been used in the United Kingdom for many years and have a growing popularity in British schools in Spain. Across the UK and Internationally over 100,000 pupils sit these assessments each year.

The assessments are standardised against tens of thousands of pupils in the United Kingdom and Internationally.

This ensures their reliability as an indicator of pupil attainment.

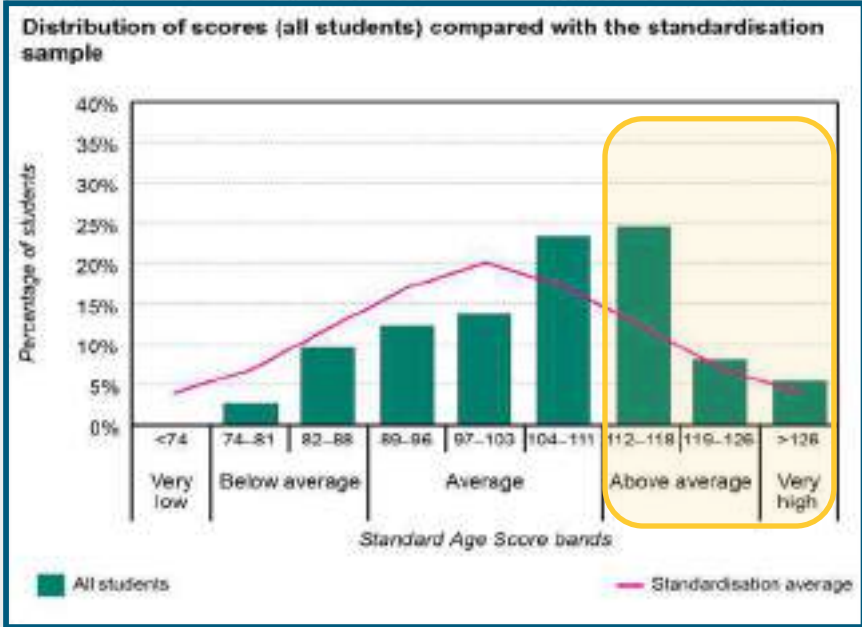

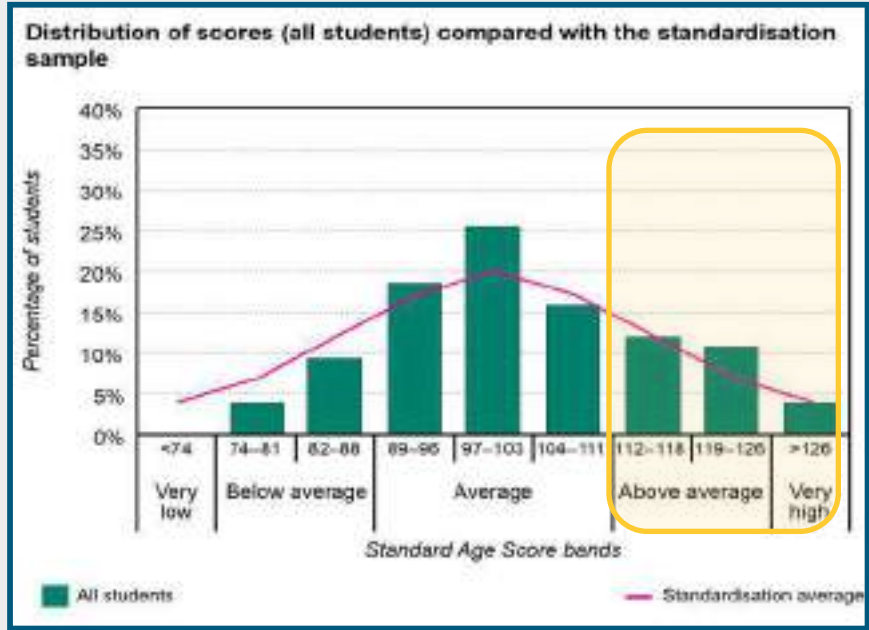

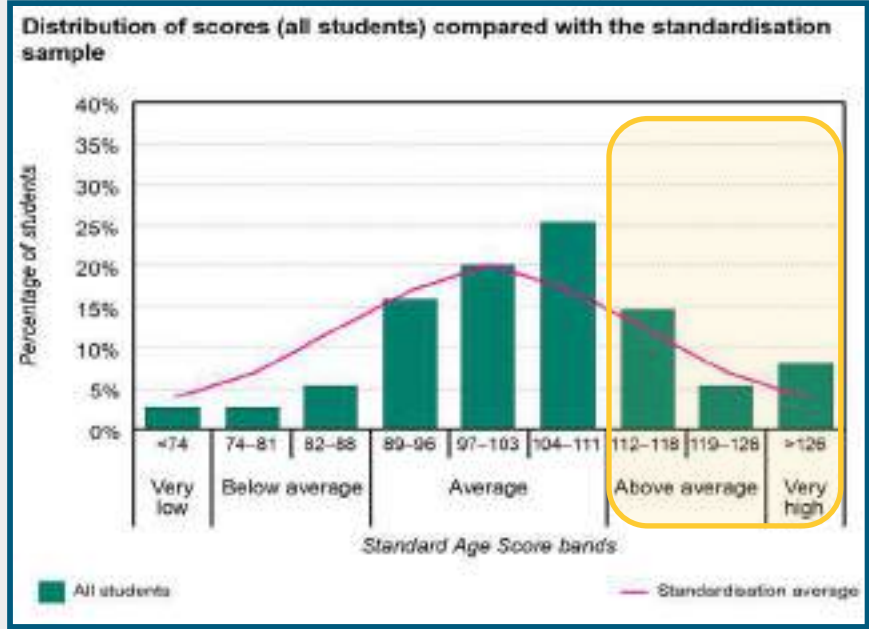
